Also have different technical environments - process of switching health record from NextGen to Epic. AHS – liability for disclosure Santa Cruz and Riverside – have a high percentage of safety net providers signed up so we should learn best practices. What can we do collectively do to support? Santa Cruz has done this for 20 years, other counties have a different delivery model and they are held within the county. This is not a clinical SHIE, there are also challenges around including social information. This will cause us to miss key areas of information and may inhibit utilization. Implementation of CHR will be delayed if not resolved. Chuck McKetney lead the discussion Non-county staff were involved in data governance committee meeting, total 26 attendees. Colleen Chawla will begin attending to help the group move forward. This is the second meeting that will include non-County individuals. The focus was to organize the group and look at Universal Authorization Form. Will continue to provide feedback to the Care Connect Steering Committee.	
Sustainability Steering Committee Prep	 Kathleen reviewed the slides Vote on new membersapproved Will there be another waiver? Scott Coffin: No new updates from the State about this. The interaction with the State and Federal government is very important and there is evidence that DHCS isn't moving forward on negotiating this with a waiver. Indicators within the state budget (i.e. taxes to help pay for the waiver) show that the funding will not be continued. We are not talking about how to sustain Care Connect as it is today. How to continue progress past 2020 into 2026? How to provide a continuity of care for people who are experiencing homelessness? How do we sustain different pieces, scale, embed and make them permanent? 	 Prepare homework for Steering Committee members to prepare for Sustainability meetings CAO representative should be part of the Steering Committee Kaiser Community Benefit at Northern California level, other foundations and tech – attend event at end of the month PACE, PACE Association

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	 We will be asking members to endorse the work of Care Connect without outcomes measures as the timeframe for services is too short, regarding different pieces of the program. There is an interdependency between pieces. Liz presented Sustainability Planning Framework, reviewed part activities (listening tour interviews, a Sustainability Working Group was convened for the first time this year, etc.). They will make recommendations to the Steering Committee to endorse or act on. Next year, we hope that individuals or organizations on the Steering Committee will serve as ambassadors to commit to, invest, endorse, or own parts of the work of Care Connect. Pillars of Care Connect – see slide Relationships being developed will hold even after the money is gone Need to determine what is the financial impact the program has had, this needs to be at the forefront of the conversation What lessons have been learned – is there an easier way to do this work that isn't as costly? How to eliminate barriers and reshape things to be done in more efficient ways will be important. We need to have a policy lens. Case management services will be provided for two years after Care Connect, need to place this onto the agenda through state associations. Central City Concern in Portland, Oregon – are we looking to acquire properties and redevelop? Measure A1, Board has committed to 2400 housing units, with 1700 for extremely low and low income, 800 for homeless.
